Being an affiliated college of Dibrugarh University, Moridhal College follows the Dibrugarh University regulations of BA/BSc/BCom programme of eight semester degree course for four year duration. Dibrugarh University is introducing (FYGUP) in Choice Based Credit System(CBCS) at undergraduate level from the Academic Session 2023-24.

# Three Year Undergraduate Programme (CBCS) for BA/BSc 3rd,4th,5th & 6th Semester Classes

#### 3. Course of Study for B.A./B.Sc. Programme:

Being an affiliated college, Moridhal College follows the Dibrugarh University Regulation of B.A./ B.Sc./B.Com. Programme of Six Semester Degree Course for three years duration(CBCS). Dibrugarh University is introducing Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) at undergraduate level from Academic Session, 2019-2020 by implementing the Dibrugarh University Regulations for the Undergraduate Academic Programmes in the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), 2018.

The CBCS is a flexible system of learning for selecting or opting subjects and courses according to students' own interest and choice. Some of the key concepts followed in the CBCS are:

**Credit :** Quantum of contents / syllabus prescribed for a course and determines number of hours of instruction required.

**Course :** A course is a unit of instruction or segment of subject area under any programme. The traditional concept 'Paper' is replaced by 'Course'.

**Honours:** The traditional concept 'Major' is replaced by 'Honours' which is the core requirement of a programme for securing degree in a specialized area or subject.

#### 3 (A). Courses of Study in B.A. under CBCS:

The course structure of B.A. (Honours) and B.A. (Non-Honours) is given below:

<u>Core Courses (For Honours)</u>: Core courses are compulsory courses to be studied as a core requirement of the programme, i.e. the courses of the subject opting for Honours. The college offers following subjects for core courses (offering honours):

Anthropology, Assamese, Economics, Education, English, Geography, Hindi, History, Mathematics, Philosophy, Political Science, Sociology and Statistics.

<u>Core Courses (For Non-Honours)</u>: The students who offer no any subject as Honours are meant Non-Honours Students. The core courses for B.A. (Non-Honours) are:

- (i) Compulsory course: General English 1.1
- (ii) Discipline Specific Course (DSC): Two courses –

  DSC 1 and DSC 2 will have to choose from the following subjects.

Anthropology, Assamese, Computer Application, Economics, Education, English, Geography, Hindi, History, Mathematics, Philosophy, Political Science, Sociology and Statistics.

#### **Elective Courses:**

- (a) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE):
- (i) <u>For Honours Students</u>: The courses of intra-departmental elective, i.e. elective courses within a particular subject opting as Honours in addition to core courses are meant DSE for the students. The courses of DSE will be all the subjects offering as Honours by the college as mentioned above in the category of core courses (Honours).
- (ii) For B.A. (Non-Honours) students, the courses of DSE will be intra-departmental elective, i.e. the courses of two subjects opted as DSC 1 and DSC 2 as mentioned above in the category of Core Courses (Non-Honours).
- (b) <u>Generic Elective (GE)</u>: The courses of inter-departmental elective, i.e. the courses of a subject other than the Honours subject are meant G.E. These courses are only for Honours students.





The traditional concept 'Non-Major' is replaced by 'Generic Elective'. The students will have to choose any one subject as GE from the following subjects.

Anthropology, Assamese, Computer Application, Economics, Education, English, Geography, Hindi, History, Mathematics, Philosophy, Political Science, Sociology and Statistics.

#### 3 (B). Courses of Study in B.Sc. under CBCS:

The course structure of B.Sc. (Honours) and B.Sc. (Non-Honours) is given below:

<u>Core Courses (For Honours)</u>: These are compulsory courses for opting Hnours. The college offers the following subjects for Core Courses (Offering Honours):

Anthropology, Botany, Chemistry, Geography, Mathematics, Physics and Zoology.

Core Courses (For Non-Honours): The students not offering Honours in any subject are considered as Non-Honours students. They will have to choose any three subjects for Discipline Specific Course (DSC), Viz. DSC1, DSC2 and DSC3 from the following subjects:

Anthropology, Botany, Chemistry, Computer Sciencce, Geography, Mathematics, Physics and Zoology.

#### **Elective Courses:**

- (a) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE): (i) For Honours students, the courses of DSE will be intradepartmental elective, i.e. elective within the particular subject opting as Honours. (ii) For B.Sc. (Non-Honours) students, the courses of DSE will be intra-departmental elective of DSC1, DSC2 and DSC3.
- (b) Generic Elective (GE):

These courses are only for Honours Students. The traditional concept 'Non-Major' is replaced by 'Generic Elective' (GE). The students will have to choose any one subject other than the Honours subject from the following:

Anthropology, Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Zoology.

#### **SWAYAM:**

Swayam is a programme initiated by Government of India and designed to achieve the three cardinal principles of Education Policy viz. access, equity and quality. The objective of this effort is to take the best teaching learing resources to all, including the most disadvantaged. SWAYAM seeks to bridge the digital device for students who have hitherto remained untouched by the digital revolution and have not been able to join the mainstream of the knowledge economy.

The course hosted on SWAYAM are in 4 quardrants -- (1) video lecture (2) specially prepared reading material that can be downloaded/printed (3) self-assessment tests through tests and quizzes and (4) an online discussion forum for clearing the doubts. Steps have been taken to enrich the learning experience by using audio-video and multi-media and state of the art pedagogy / technology.

Courses delivered through SWAYAM are available on free of cost to the learners, however intending students registered, shall be offered a certificate on successful completion of the course, with a little fee. At the end of each course, there will be an assessment of the student through proctored examination and the marks/grades secured in this exam could be transferred to the academic record of the students.

In effect, Moridhal College has introduced SWAYAM from the academic session 2018-19 and a Coordination Committee constituted for effective implementation.

#### 10. Dr. Kamal Gogoi Central (KGCL) Library Facilities:

Dr. Kamal Gogoi Central Library (KGCL), Moridhal College founded at the time of the inception of the college itself. Initially it was housed in one of the large halls of a spacious single storied building. During 1988, the library accommodated about 2,700 books. The College recognised by the government as a Gran-in-Aid under deficit system in 25th March, 1998. By end of the session 2000, it reached the number books upto 4125. During the year 1995 the librarian has been appointed. In 1996, the management of the library was rested on a Library Advisory Committee formed with the members from the faculties and other stake holders of the college. When the volume of books started increasing, it has been shifted to an independent building in 2006.

Now the number of Texts and reference books crossed 31,278 in 2022-23.

The library has connected with INFLIBNET's N-LIST Programme since 2010. It provides 31,35,000+ e-books and 6,000+ e- journals.

The library uses AACR- II for cataloguing and DDC21 for classification.

#### 14. DISCIPLINE & RESTRICTIONS:

#### Discipline:

Students shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of the college in force. They shall give due respect to the teachers and staff of the college and shall show decent and cordial behaviour to other students.

#### Uniform:

- **N.B.:** 1. Uniform must be descent and not uncouth in the name of fashion. Wearing ballon-fashioned trousers and leggings are strictly prohibited.
  - 2. Hair cut of other than descent look is not permissible.
  - 3. Wearing of ear-rings, bracelets and chains by boy students except on customary and religious ground are restricted.
  - 4. Tattoo of any kind is not only harmful but also odd looking and hence unacceptable.

#### Restictions:

The following are the restictions imposed upon the students of the college

- (a) Ragging of any type inside and outside the campus.(Provision for prohibition of ragging is given in detail in clause 20)
- (b) Disruption of Classes.
- (c) Destruction of college property.
- (d) Misbehaviour to the teachers, employees, students and other fellows.
- (e) Use of drugs, Gutkha, smoking etc.
- (f) Entering with weapons.
- (g) Active party politics which can disturb the academic & general atmosphere of the college.
- (h) Use of Mobile Phone inside the Class Room.
- (i) Any other activities which demean the good name of the college.

#### Identity Card:

All students require to get their identity cards issued at the time of their admission. They must keep identity cards at all times with them while in the college. Students' entry into the campus may be denied for non possession of valid identity card.



#### Attendance:

as:

Regular attendance in the classes is compulsory. The percentage of attendance of students is recorded daily. Only a regular student of H.S. having a minimum of 80% of class attendance in each subject may be allowed to appear the term-end examinations. A student who fails to attend 80% of the classes on reasonable grounds may be allowed to appear in the said examination as an institutional private or Non-collegiate candidate on payment of non-collegiate fee. But such students must have at least 75% class attendance. For B.A./B.Sc. Programmes under semester system, a student must have 80% of class attendance to become a regular student. Failing of which he/she shall not be elligible for appearing in the End Semester Examination.

#### 15. EXAMINATIONS

- Sessional Test: In addition to AHSEC's, the college will conduct two compulsory Sessional Examinations of 50 marks for the students of H.S. course. There shall be two In-semester Examinations for B.A./B.Sc. students in each semester bearing 40 marks for each paper.
- Class Test: Class tests are also conducted from time to time by the concerned department.
- Internal Assessment: There shall be 10% Marks for assessing the conversation skill of students in language subjects i.e. General English and MIL (Hindi) in H.S 1st year class. On the other hand under semester system of D.U. 20% marks is alloted for internal assessment and 80% marks shall be for theory part of every course. Out of total 20 marks of internal assessment 50% marks will be for Insemester Exams and 25% for seminar, group discussion. etc. and 25% marks for class attendence.

having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:

JUSTICE, social, economic and political;

LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship;

EQUALITY of status and of opportunity; and to promote among them all

FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual

and the unity and integrity of the Nation;

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, do HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.



# **Fundamental Rights**

The Constitution offers all citizens, individually and collectively, some basic freedoms. These are guaranteed in the Constitution in the form of six broad categories of Fundamental Rights, which are justifiable. Article 12 to 35 contained in Part III of the Constitution deal with Fundamental Rights. These are:

- Right to equality, including equality before law, prohibition of discrimination on grounds of religion, race, caste, sex or place of birth, and equality of opportunity in matters of employment.
- Right to freedom of speech and expression, assembly, association or union, movement, residence, and right to practice any profession or occupation (some of these rights are subject to security of the State, friendly relations with foreign countries, public order, decency or morality).
- Right against exploitation, prohibiting all forms of forced labour, child labour and traffic in human beings.
- Right to freedom of conscience and free profession, practice, and propagation of religion.
- Right of any section of citizens to conserve their culture, language or script, and right of minorities to establish and administer educational institutions of their choice; and Right to constitutional remedies for enforcement of Fundamental Rights.

# **Fundamental Duties**

To abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem,

- To cherish and follow the noble ideals that inspired the national struggle for freedom,
- To uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India,
- To defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so,
- To promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities and to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women,
- To value and preserve the rich heritage of the country's composite culture,
- To protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers and wildlife and to have compassion for living creatures,
- To develop scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform,
- To safeguard public property and to abjure violence,
- To strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement, and
- To provide opportunities for education to his child or ward between the age of six and fourteen years (added by the 86th Constitutional Amendment Act, 2002).
