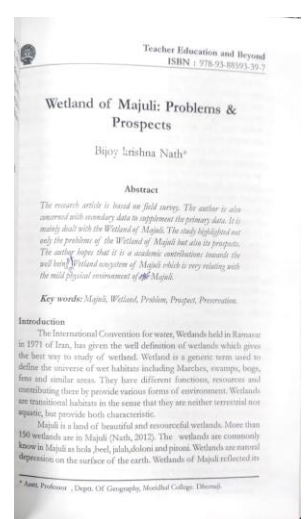


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Reason behind Low Political Participation of Indian Women: A Literary Survey

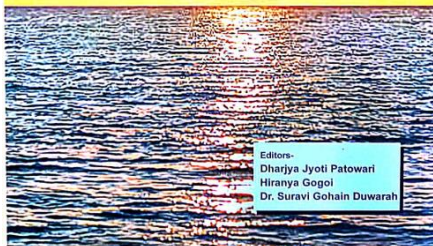
